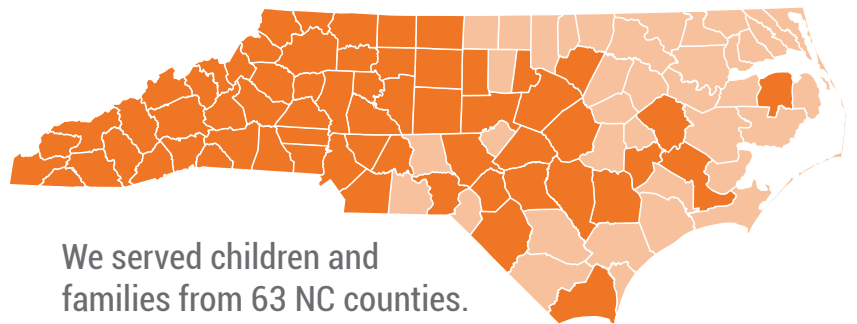

Sometimes, little boys just need to be rowdy. That was the case for 8-year-old twin brothers Isaac and Jacob, who are currently in foster care. Last year, Isaac and Jacob's teacher noticed they wore the same clothes to school three days in a row. After being unable to reach the children's mother, DSS conducted a home visit and discovered she was struggling with alcohol dependency. With no immediate family nearby, the boys were temporarily placed with a loving CHA foster family while their mom entered a rehabilitation program.

Within days, the once quiet boys got comfortable in their new space. According to their foster mom, Mindy, "They would literally bounce off the walls. Or the couches. Or the counters. They were balls of energy."



Our staff explored opportunities that would allow the boys to release some of their energy, and they discovered a great karate program nearby. These adorable little ninjas absolutely loved their classes, and the fees were covered by our Grandparents Club funds, thanks to generous supporters like you!



When Jackie lost her cousin to suicide, the world she knew changed overnight. Once expressive and creative, she withdrew into herself, wearing the same oversized hoodie and worn jeans each day as she struggled to process her grief. Her pain surfaced in quiet tears, sharp words, and a growing distance between her and her family.

Concerned and searching for support, Jackie's mother reached out after learning about Children's Hope Alliance therapists available at her daughter's school. Meeting her therapist in a familiar, trusted environment made it easier for Jackie to take the first step.

Jackie found a safe space to grieve and begin healing. She learned it was ok to feel these painful feelings, but that she did not have to carry them alone. Over time, the weight she carried began to lift. With support from CHA, Jackie started to reconnect with herself, her family, and the creative spirit that once defined her.

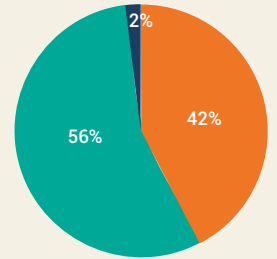

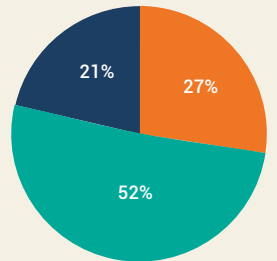

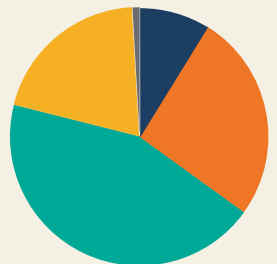
